CUBA.

' A Havana telegram of the 27th says that 2,000 soldiers arrived there from Spain on the 26th. The Cuban Col. RYAN, according to Panama advices by way of Jamaica, arrived at Panama Dec. 12 with a quantity of ammunition and arms for the Cuban insurgents, and a force of 150 men. A reinforcoment was expected at Aspinwall. RYAN was awaiting the arrival of a steamer from New-York (the Hornel) to carry his stores and men to Cuba, but she had not arrived at Aspin wall up to Dec. 21. Capt. CRAIG. of the bark Speedaway, and three sailors, were drowned in the harbor of Cardenas, Dec. 26. The cashier of MIGUEL ANTONIA HERRERA, of Havana, has absconded with \$80,000.
