Subject: Operations of Aerovias Q.

Sir:

I have the honor to refer to Department's airgram No. 1043 of August 15 and Embassy's despatch no. 2059 of August 20, entitled "Operations of Aerovias Q", and advise that since this despatch

was sent, the following additional information has been obtained by the Commercial Attaché regarding

the operation of this Cuban company.

Aerovias Q now has five DC-3's. They are gradually reducing them to impotency through a process of cannibalism, taking parts from one machine to use in another. The Embassy's informant, Warren PINE, of Pan American and Cia. Cubana de Aviacion, said that he did not expect any competition from this company from a real operating point-of-view and was inclined to agree with the opinion expressed on several occasions by others that Aerovias Q was too ambitious a proposition and that it would eventually fall by the wayside if it failed to create for itself a sufficient nuisance value to result in a profitable sale to some local company.

Mr. Donald STEWART, Vice President of Expreso Aero Interamericano, stated in strictest confidence that his company had been approached by Aerovias Q

with a proposition to sell, but that they would not touch it. Mr. Stewart further stated that they recently were hiring stewardesses for their own lines and one applied saying that she had been employed by Aerovias & for three months on the Habana-Varadero run and, while she had received a uniform, she had received no pay in that period.

Aerovias Q is not adequately financed and that the "investments" of Colonel Genovevo PEREZ and Inocente ALVAREZ, Minister of State, and other persons highly placed in the Cuban Government have not been accompanied by investments of funds but merely an investment of influence in return for blocks of stock. One of the financers of the venture is reported to have said that they are scraping the bottom of the barrel.

The matter of Aerovias Q is one of great interest in local aviation circles. It is being followed closely and will be reported on as occasion warrants.
