

SURRENDER OF COL. TITUS AND OTHERS.

Under the head of "Nicaragua War," the *Cronica*, of Costa Rica, of May 6, says:—

On the 27th of April, at 6 o'clock in the morning, we again opened fire and commenced to demolish some of the fortifications of Rivas. The panic returned among some of the adherents of Walker's army, desertion from his troops commenced again; finally the most celebrated, Titus, two Majors, two Captains, one Lieutenant, one Surgeon, a German Engineer and lawyer, and some seventy men more presented themselves to the General in Chief Mora.

The women, as well foreigners as natives, had been removed from the plaza through the care of Mr. Davis, the Captain of the sloop of war *St. Marys*, who passed into our encampment and thence to San Juan.
