

Late from Nicaragua.

The news from Nicaragua shows that WALKER'S star is on the ascendant. The following news was received by the Texas, which arrived at New Orleans, on the 17th, with San Juan dates to the 10th :

Col. Titus and Lockbridge proceeded up the river and attacked 300 Costa Ricans at Cody's Point, at the mouth of the Peripuga River, and defeated them with great loss.—American loss trifling.

The steamer's machinery getting out of order, they came back to Punta Arenas, repaired and had gone back again. There was little doubt but they would be in full possession of the river in a week. Dates from Walker are to the 3d ult., by the Orizaba from Panama. The enemy under Cora had appeared near Rivas and been driven back on the 28th. Henningsen with 400 men attacked 1,500 of the enemy at St. George, driving them from their position.

Then returning to Rivas, Walker's whole force fit for duty was 1,300 men, of whom 1,109 were in excellent health and spirits. He had provisions and ammunition for three months. A private dispatch to the agent of the Associated Press, dated Greytown, 10th, confirms the foregoing.
