

## Fly Wrote a Diary While Captive

MONTEVIDEO, Uruguay, March 6 (AP)—Dr. Claude L. Fly, the United States agronomist released Tuesday after seven months captivity by Tupamaro guerrillas, has written an account of his ordeal, his son John disclosed today.

The Tupamaros delivered the 600-page diary an essay on freedom to the British Hospital here when they released Dr. Fly there. Dr. Fly, 65 years old, is in the hospital recovering from a heart attack suffered last month while he was held by the kidnappers.

"I'm going to start going over the pages pretty soon," said John Fly, who arrived here with his mother from Fort Collins, Colo., yesterday for a reunion with Dr. Fly.

Dr. Fly's condition was described today as "stabilized and without complications." John and his mother met

John and his mother met with him for an hour again today. John, 27, a political science instructor at Colorado State University, said his father was "feeling real good."

During his captivity, Dr. Fly learned to speak Spanish,
