The line was formed on Canal street, and the extreme left was eked out with small fragmentary corps of the Washington Artillery, a most efficient company for its numbers under that excellent officer, Capt. Smith; the Louisiana Volunteers under Capt. Tombink, a veteran of the Mexican war; the Riflemen of Lafayette, under Capt. Burns, forming, with a few of the Crescent Hussars, a battalion under the command of Brigadier General Tracy, whose skill and military experience deserved a large force.

The line was reviewed by General Lewis on foot, accompanied by his Aids. The General fulfilled his duty and the requisition of the law by walking up the line and observing the men as they passed in open column. But this, we must say, is a most unsatisfactory mode of reviewing troops. Until a more thorough and complete system is introduced, it is impossible that our Volunteer companies will ever compare with those of the northern cities, where the Volunteer companies frequently shame, by the order and precision of their movements, the best drilled corps in the regular army.

The company drill is sadly neglected in the Legion, and though the men are very fine-looking, and the material equals any we ever knew, the want of regular company parades gives them, in the lines, or on the march, an appearance by no means compact or soldierly. *Means*

*is* This corps is the pride of our city; it has long received a large appropriation from the state, and its ability and promptitude are acknowledged by all of our citizens. All that it requires, is a better, more frequent, and regular company and squad drill.

MILITARY PARADE.

There was quite a fine turn out of the Legion, but only a small display from the Second Municipality. They paraded under orders from General Lewis, who read to companies his correspondence with the State Auditor.

It appears that the Legislature last winter passed a law granting \$2500. a year for two years. But unluckily the item was not inserted into the appropriation bill, so that the military of New Orleans, must do without their usual supplies. This oversight is most unpardonable.

NATIONAL GUARDS - TARGET SHOOTING

Companies C, D, E, of the new corps of National Guards went on an excursion yesterday to Bayou des Allemands for the purpose of making their first trial of skill with their fire arms. At an hour inconveniently early for the habits of not a few of the party, to-wit: about 7 o'clock A. M., the two Companies C and D met at the Arsenal, and being formed into columns, with the field officers, Colonel Forno, Lieutenant-Colonel Jacques, Major Smith, and several invited guests from other corps and from the citizens, the whole being under the command of Captain Dreux, of Company C, marched to the headquarters of Company E, in the Second District where it was saluted by this latter Company, which is composed almost entirely of Creoles under that fine officer, Captain Voorhies, who was prevented from being present by sickness. His place on the occasion was well supplied by Lieutenant Vincent.

The battalion was then formed, with the Rifles ( D ), under that admirable light infantry officer, Captain Salomon, on the left, and marched to the Third District Ferry. Crossing the river, a special train was in readiness for the party, and, pleasantly seated in exceedingly comfortable and handsome cars.

Considering the indifferent character of the weapons which the Federal Government assigns to our Volunteers - the only real army of the country - the practice was excellent. Company C, Captain Dreux, made the best target, putting fifty-two out of seventy odd balls in a board of the size of a man, at a distance of ninety yards. This Company used the percussion musket. The Rifles (D) made very good shooting, forty-eight out of sixty odd balls striking the target. We observed that the cartridges used by the Rifles included too much powder, which with the hard triggers prevented this from being one of the best targets ever made by a Volunteer corps.

The gallant Creole Company E made very good shooting for such arms as the State had allowed them, consisting of old muskets that have been condemned by the Department and have mostly served through the Mexican war. It is disgraceful that such weapons should be placed in the hands of our citizen-soldiers. After the companies had all fired, the field officers and some of the civilians made a display of their skill. Colonel Forno not only bore off the honors of the contest, but made the best shot of the day, leading to the playful suggestion that the Colonel should be reduced to the



ranks, as he handled the rifle and muskets so much better than his men. The prizes were then distributed. Lieutenant Vincent, with some appropriate remarks, presented the prize to the best shots of Company E - who were Private John Dawson - Gold medal. Private J. V. Aime - Silver medal.

The medals of Company D were presented, with a few appropriate remarks, by Alexander Walker, of the Delta, to - Private A. Elot - Gold medal; Sergeant M. Bozant - Silver medal.

Charles Callahan, of the Picayune, made the presentation to the winners of Company C, in a neat and graceful speech. Private Rufus Hunt - Gold medal; Private J. S. Mount - Silver medal.

After the target exercise the companies were put through various manoeuvres, in which they showed very good drill.

The display of light Infantry movements by Captain Salmon's company was particularly pleasing.
