

Col. Lockridge and the Walker Expedition.

I am assured by Col. LOCKRIDGE, in person, that he entertains no idea of joining the Walker Expedition, as it was reported that he would do with reinforcements; but that he has dissolved all connection with Gen. WALKER and his enterprise, although still professing an ardent sympathy with both. The Colonel thinks that Gen. WALKER's chances of success in reëstablishing his Government in Nicaragua are excellent, and speaks most sanguinely and enthusiastically of the consummation most devoutly to be wished. Gen. HENNINGSON is also here. It is understood that he will join WALKER without fail.
