WHEREAS, on or about the fifteenth of February last, two valuable Negroes were stolen, and carried away, from Doctor Waring's plantation on Waccamaw River, by a man called Baldwing who was

employed by him as an overseer: I hereby offer a reward of TIVO HUNDRED DOLLARS, to any person, who shall arrest and deliver him to any Sheriff or Gaoler o this state, to be duly confined in gaol on the charge of negro stealing, until

thence delivered by due course of law. Baldwin is about five feet five, to seven inches in height, from twenty-seven to thirty years of

and is very plausible: his old is more effeminate, than strong and many; was surveyor in the Missisppi Territory; and kept a school on the Long Lug in this state, during summer; he says he

Is a native of Massachusetts, but more probably it is supposed from Virginia. And I do hereby earnestly require, and strictly enjoin, all Officers of this state civil and military, and all authorities of the same, to be vigilant in

arresting, trying, and bringing to justice, and to due and lawful punishment, all persons, charged with negro stealing ; which, has of late encreased to a degree, requiring such punishments, as the laws of the state authorize; and which shall, in proper cases, be carried into full effect ; so far, as depends upon the authorities and powers, with which, I am invested.

Witness my Hand, and the Great Seal of the state, at Hopeland; this first day of March. in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten, and in the thirty-fourth year of American Independence. JOHN DRAYTON.
