

The New York *Tribune* has a long letter from Detroit, which professes to give the originals of some of the characters in "Uncle Tom's Cabin." George Harris is said to have been the pseudonym of Lewis Clarke, an intelligent slave, owned in Kentucky. In 1841 he escaped to Ohio and passed on to Canada. Returning in 1842, he spent some time at Oberlin, where he acquired a fair education. He aided one or two of his brothers to escape from bondage, and assisted them to an education. Lewis afterward went to lecturing, and stumped the Northern states on the anti-slavery platform. He is now a farmer and lives in Canada. For the other characters in the story, we have Samuel Peter, a Methodist minister in Canada, as Uncle Tom; Della, the sister of Clarke, as Emeline, etc.
