And sure enough on Monday she appeared. It seems that on changing cars at New Haven she went back after something that one of the children had forgotten, and was left behind. And the faithful creature, finding herself left, and only intent on reaching her mistress, immediately started off, following the railroad track as her guide, and, sleeping out that night, pushed on all day Sunday, and slept out the next night, and reached here Monday morning about eleven o'clock, having travelled the whole sixty miles on foot.
