New York, June 27.—The Herald publishes the tollowing account of the sailing of a Cuban expedition under Col. Ryan, who es-

caped from the efficers:

The mysterious movements of fillibusterers during the last week between New York and New Jersey were for the purpose of mystity. ing the authorities and Spanish spies and test the reliability of the men. The men left their various heulquarters at 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon in squals, carrying carpet bags, By hill have six searcely a man remained at the various headquarters. The men, when approaching the tags, said they were going to the Fishing Binks. The tugs transferred the men to the steamer, which proceeded to sea with 800 men organized under the name of the First New York Regiment. Among officers abourd were Col. Ryan. Capt. Peters, Gu. Spear, the Feuten civalrymin, Capt. Auderson, of Richmond, Va., and Dr. G V. Derset, also of Richmond, who goes out as Eledical Director. No aims or amunition, except a lew sido aims, revolvers and a few Lieumgton rifles were aboard. Large quantitles of arms and amunition were dispatched previously by a steamer auderstood to be the Quaker City, which is awai ing the expedition ut sea. The volunteers take with them an elegant fleg, inscribed, "First New York Regiment Cub in Volunteers."

The Herald also says: Col. Ryan, after excaping on Wednesday, went to Brooklyn, where he was concented in the house of a friend nu'll Thursday night, when he proceeded, disguised as an express driver, to

another place and remained in a house within two blocks of the Ludlow street prison until 9 o'clock Saturday right.

The Times states: The Quaker City is waiting for the expedition outside the Narrows. The men were to be transferred to her. Goneral Gioncuria is commander in chief, but Colonel Ryan leads the volunteers. A number of officers of the late United States volunteers are in the ranks to be appointed to positions on their arrival. The Quaker City has on board 5000 Remington rifles, 2 batteries of artillery and equipments for a brigade of cavalry, with an abundance of ammunition.

NEW YORK, June 27.—One of the fifteen gunboats building here for the Spanish navy was launched yesterday and towed to the foot of Vesey street to receive her machinery. The contract requires the completion of the entire number by August 1.
