THE FREEDMAN'S BANK IN BANKRUPTCY.

The Freedman's bank has been put in the hands of three commissioners by the trustees, and its affairs will be wound up. This action was taken at this time particularly to anticipate the notices given during the panic by depositors, many of which expired, yesterday, and payment of which was refused, to-day, as they were presented. It is asserted the creditors of the bank will lose very little, if anything, and possibly the bank may be able to arrange its affairs after a time, so as to renew its business on a sound basis. The commissioners nominated by the trustees are Robert Purvis (colored) of Philadelphia, ex-Postmaster General Creswell, and L. Leipold, now at the head of the sub-treasury.
