Nat Turner.—To satisfy public curiosity, we mention the last reports, which are going the rounds in the public prints, in relation to the infamous wretch whose name is placed at the head of this article. One report is, that he has been seen and shot at, but without effect, by two young men near Fincastle; ano. ther, that in making his way to Ohio, he was drowned in attempting to cross New River, in Green Brier county, Virginia; and the last and most probable (though we doubt the truth of all) is, that he was seen a few days ago in Southampton by a fellow servant, who gave immediate information to the whites, and that in a short time five or six hundred persons were in pursuit of him; that he had not been taken, but his place of concealment (a cave, not far from the scene of his atrocities,) had been discovered, and some arms, provisons, &c. found. Strong hopes were entertained that the murderous brigand would soon fall into the bands of justice.

Four or five more slaves have been convicted by the Court of Southampton.—Ral. Star.
