

Captain Farnum, who claims the distinction of having commanded the yacht Wanderer in her famous cruise for African negroes, has been in town recently, and will, it is understood, soon publish a history of his voyage, giving such facts relative to the business of importing negroes as he may deem it expedient to make known. Captain Farnum insists that the slave trade is an eminently humane and civilizing operation, and highly agreeable to the African.
