

HORSE THIEVES LYNCHED.—The Leavenworth, (Kansas) *Herald* reports that on the 5th inst., a party of nine armed men arrested, without legal process, one Henry Woffle and son, and Charles Doy, son of Dr. John Doy, on a charge of horse stealing. They were tried, found guilty, and then sentenced to death. Doy and young Woffle made their escape, the latter after being badly wounded. The old man Woffle was shot and his body left on the prairie. The next night the same company, learning that Doy was concealed in a house owned by old man Woffle, surrounded it by ten o'clock, waited until daylight, procured a load of hay, fired it and succeeded in dislodging him. He was tried, condemned, and immediately suffered death.
