THIEVING INDIAN LYNCHED IN TROLEMNE COUNTY. -The Tuolumna Courier (Columbia) says, that an ed Charley, noted as a thief, and considered a "bad Wally," among his own people, stole a lot of ools and a new suit of clothes from a man named Wallace, up on Turnback. A party started in pursuit as soon as the theft was discovered, and he was traced to Roach's Camp, where he had appeared during the day dressed in a \$25 coat, fine black pants yest white shirt and a Kosenth hat Here he showed two demorrectypes, one being of a lady, which was taken from him. Mr. Indian then went to Ward's Ferry, where he nawned his vest and the other ministure for a restace. He then proceeded to Garote, where he was captured on 13th February by the party in pursuit. He was tried by Judge Lynch, and sentenced to receive thirty lashes -twenty-five with a cat, and the remainder with a hand-saw-and to have his head shaved, and one ear

eronned: which sentence was duly executed. He was then locked up, and a guard placed over him until Sunday morning, lith February, when he was taken to Roach's Camp, and liberated—having informed where the stolen articles had been secreted
