

**THIEVING INDIAN LYNCHED IN TULUMNE COUNTY.**  
—The *Tulumne Courier* (Columbia) says, that an Indian, named Charley, noted as a thief, and considered a "bad Wally," among his own people, stole a lot of tools and a new suit of clothes from a man named Wallace, up on Turnback. A party started in pursuit as soon as the theft was discovered, and he was traced to Roach's Camp, where he had appeared during the day, dressed in a \$25 coat, fine black pants, vest, white shirt and a Kossuth hat. Here he showed two daguerreotypes, one being of a lady, which was taken from him. Mr. Indian then went to Ward's Ferry, where he pawned his vest and the other miniature for a passage. He then proceeded to Garote, where he was captured on 13th February by the party in pursuit. He was tried by Judge Lynch, and sentenced to receive thirty lashes—twenty-five with a cat, and the remainder with a hand-saw—and to have his head shaved, and one ear cropped; which sentence was duly executed. He was then locked up, and a guard placed over him until Sunday morning, 14th February, when he was taken to Roach's Camp, and liberated—having informed where the stolen articles had been secreted.
